CONFESSION OF SINS

THE WORD

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON Hosea 5:15-6:6 “Why God Wounds” ⁵Then I will go back to my place until they admit their guilt. And they will seek my face; in their misery they will earnestly seek me.” ¹⁴Come, let us return to the LORD. He has torn us to pieces but he will heal us; he has injured us but he will bind up our wounds. ²After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will restore us, that we may live in his presence. ³Let us acknowledge the LORD; let us press on to acknowledge him. As surely as the sun rises, he will appear; he will come to us like the winter rains, like the spring rains that water the earth.” ⁴⁴What can I do with you, Ephraim? What can I do with you, Judah? Your love is like the morning mist, like the early dew that disappears. ⁵Therefore I cut you in pieces with my prophets, I killed you with the words of my mouth; my judgments flashed like lightning upon you. ⁶For I desire mercy, not sacrifice, and acknowledgment of God rather than burnt offerings.

EPISTLE LESSON Romans 4:18-25 “God Keeps His Promises” ¹⁸Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed and so became the father of many nations, just as it had been said to him, “So shall you offspring be.” ¹⁹Without weakening in his faith, he faced the fact that his body was as good as dead--since he was about a hundred years old--and that Sarah's womb was also dead. ²⁰Yet he did not waver through unbelief regarding the promise of God, but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God, ²¹being fully persuaded that God had power to do what he had promised. ²²This is why “it was credited to him as righteousness.” ²³The words “it was credited to him” were written not for him alone, ²⁴but also for us, to whom God will credit righteousness--for us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead. ²⁵He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification.

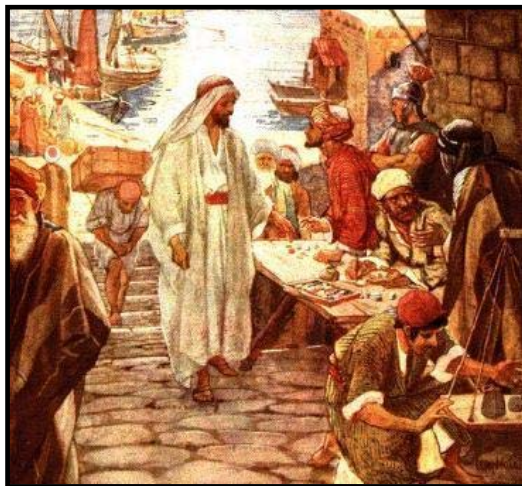
“Dirty Jobs”

NICENE CREED
