Old Testament Lesson – Isaiah 6:1-8 “Here I Am Lord” ¹In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a throne, high and exalted, and the train of his robe filled the temple. ²Above him were seraphs, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. ³And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." ⁴At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke. ⁵"Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty." ⁶Then one of the seraphs flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for." ⁸Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

“No More Fear”

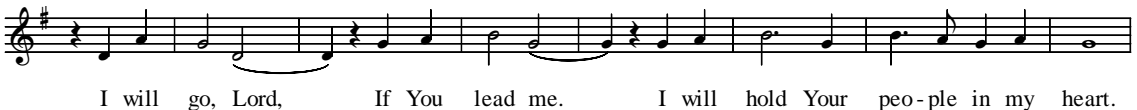
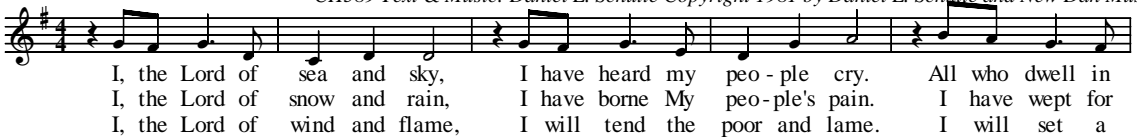
Romans 8:14-17

Receiving The Sacrament of Lord's Supper

P: We receive the Sacrament with repentant hearts:

C: If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins. (1 John 1:8-9)

P: We receive the Sacrament with believing hearts:

C: Take and eat; this is my body. This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. (Matthew 26:26, 28)

P: We receive the Sacrament with remembering hearts:

C: For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. (1 Corinthians 11:26)

P: We receive the Sacrament with one heart:

C: Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf. (1 Corinthians 10:17)
